



Update required to strengthen your personal LastPass Vault

To enhance the security of your personal LastPass account, you need to **update your master password hash iteration value by May 13, 2024**. If you don't, the iteration count will automatically update next time you login and you may need to [relink your business account](#). Take the simple steps outlined below to avoid this.

What do I need to do?

Be prepared: This update will log you out of your account. Be sure you know your LastPass username and master password. [Set up account recovery](#) so you don't get locked out of your account.

Change your settings, by following these steps:

1. Open your vault
2. Go to account settings
 - a. On desktop: select 'Show Advanced Settings'
 - b. On mobile: tap 'Security > Password iterations'
3. Enter '600000' (no comma) to set your iteration count

What's a hash iteration?

While this may sound technical, it's a simple update that significantly strengthens the encryption of your vault.
